What is a CSA?

Community Supported Agriculture (CSA) is a relationship between people and a local family farm. The relationship is based on the premise that farms need communities and that communities need farms. Community members invest in farms in the spring when the farm cash flow is lowest. In return, farmers provide food throughout the season to those who invested in them. It is a symbiotic relationship that helps to maintain access to healthy food by providing economic support to farms when they need it most. Our CSA delivers a box of vegetables, weekly, to many central drop-off locations for eighteen weeks.

Share Details



Beginning in June and running into October, you will receive a weekly box filled with tasty produce that is freshly picked. The container holds either a bushel for a full share, or a 1/2 bushel for a half share of produce.

Boxes are usually 1/2 to 3/4 full in the beginning and ending months, and overflowing in the heart of the summer. In addition, we will send you recipes so you can enjoy your fresh vegetables in a variety of ways. These recipes are also on our website. We have an Early Bird Special Price available for those who sign up before February 21st. Members can receive an extra 10% discount on shares for working on the farm during the season. Four hours for a full share and two hours for a half share.



Where do you pick up your weekly shares?

Tuesdays in Kenosha at the resident's on 4017 7th Ave.

Wednesdays at the Edgebrook Farmers' Market in Rockford, IL (9 am - 1 pm)

Thursdays at the farm west of Beloit or in Janesville at the resident's on 620 E. Holmes St.

And Saturday Farmers Markets when they are in session: Beloit, WI (8 am -1 pm), and Park Ridge, IL (7 am - 1 pm)

Fall Storage Share

Another option for members is our Fall Storage Share. This share consists of four to five large



deliveries throughout the summer and November of storage items. When you receive these shares, you will be able to can and freeze some items like tomatoes and broccoli, while simply storing other times like potatoes, flour and beans. This will allow you to eat locally grown organic produce throughout the year.

Items we expect to deliver for storage shares include: black beans, whole wheat flour, cucumbers, winter squash, tomatoes, potatoes, green beans, cabbage, and other vegetables when they become available.

These items are only guaranteed in accordance to a good growing season. These items will be delivered in larger quantities and will need to be processed shortly after delivery.
